FROM **DEMONISED MAN** TO EVANGELIST THANKS TO FRIENDS LIKE YOU!

Salim Ndugu was ruled by evil spirits and a thirst for power - until he met Jesus. Now, with your support, this passionate speaker is one of many AE evangelists spreading the life-changing message of the Gospel across the continent.

Salim Bakundukize Ndugu's father had three wives, and Salim was the ninth child born to his mother. As a Muslim man, Salim respected the laws of Islam and actively recruited others.

But in spite of all this active involvement with Islam, he found himself searching for fulfilment in other things.

"I began going to traditional witchdoctors," he said, "seeking evil spirits, thinking they would give me peace."

He felt those evil spirits with him even when he went to the mosque to pray.

"I sought power in all sorts of ways," said Salim. "I felt no guilt about it," he said, "and as I continued in witchcraft, I turned into something like a walking demon. People feared me, but I still had no peace."

That was until one day, in a prayer room at his local mosque, Salim was on his knees asking for peace within himself, when Jesus came to him in a vision.

"I met Jesus Christ right there and ..

. He took me by surprise!" Salim shares. "I confessed my sins, and sought out Christians to pray for me. From that time, I felt Jesus hold me in His hands."

For the first time in his life, Salim went home with peace in his heart. The next morning, he gathered all the charms and potions he had received from witchdoctors, and burnt them in a final surrender of his life to Christ.

Salim now works for African Enterprise Rwanda and is a passionate evangelist. He uses his testimony to minister to other Rwandans who are trapped in the life of witchcraft and false religion, and many people have been set free because of his story.

"Because of what Jesus has done for me, I have resolved to tell [others] that He is the true Lord," he said. "I am determined to witness to other people until my last breath!"

EX-GANG MEMBER: "I'M A CHANGED PERSON!"

On a cool morning in June, Ernest Owusu pulled a shirt on over the gun and dagger tattoos on his arms, and went to the street with his friends to

At 26, he'd already served time in prison for armed robbery and was addicted to the substances he inhaled every day.

That day, a group of strangers approached and said they had come to tell the men about Jesus. They spoke about love and forgiveness, and Ernest felt something change in his heart. He decided to ask their God for help.

"I am really thankful for African Enterprise coming to our city," he said. "They showed me the way to God."

Ernest has joined a church and, since AE's Kumasi Mission in 2016, has been learning more about God. He's also asked to join AE Ghana's vocational training program to gain skills and find a job.

"I know I'm a changed person now and Jesus has forgiven all my sins," he said. "Now I am happy."


BRINGS RWANDANS TO CHRIST

ACCRA SOUTH, GHANA 15-28 NOVEMBER (REVISED DATE), 'THE YEAR OF GOD'S VISITATION'.

This region of Ghana's capital contains many communities in need. There are many immigrants from Nigeria and Togo who live as squatters, as well as many local Ghanaian squatters.

- Please pray for the city to be transformed by the power of the Gospel, so that crime, especially armed robbery, drug addiction and prostitution,
- Pray especially for 500 leaders to be equipped and mobilised to go on and organise training for a further 1,000 church members.

LUSAKA, ZAMBIA 4-11 NOVEMBER, 'CITY ARISE LEADERSHIP MISSION'

As Zambia is emerging from the 2016 presidential and parliamentary elections, the time is right to focus on Godly leadership and good governance in the small landlocked nation in southern Africa.

- AE Ghana has the goal to share the transformative Gospel with 1,300 leaders. Please pray that the strategy of creating five fellowships for leaders in different professions will bear good fruit.
- Pray for wisdom and integrity in the new government, and for the Spirit to move powerfully in people's hearts.

DESSIE. ETHIOPIA 21–24 DECEMBER

Dessie is a city located in the remote North East of Ethiopia, and is one of the most unreached areas in the country. For three years, your prayers have been building up Christian leaders at Dessie University.

- Please pray now that this mission will engage the students in mission work and boost the campus ministry to a higher level.
- Please pray that the ambitious target of reaching 11,000 people with the Gospel, and to grow the church in Dessie and Kombolcha by 10% in just one year will be reached!
- Please also lift up the plans to visit prison inmates, and rebuild shanty houses. The plan is to provide cleaning materials for each of the 600 inmates and preach the Gospel to them.
