Age: 17 years old Vocation: Dressmaking

Ophelia is the second of four siblings. She completed her JHS* education and wanted to further her education to the SHS*, but her parents couldn't cater for her because of financial constraints.

Ophelia says she has been a Christian throughout her life. Though life was a struggle for her, she believed deep inside that one day God would breakthrough for her. After Junior High School she had to fend for herself hawking bread. Ophelia says her dream is to become a fashion designer.



A volunteer of AE, Pastor Isaac, introduced her to AE, and Ophelia was enrolled in the dressmaking centre. She is very happy and gives all thanks to God and AE.

Name: Mary Esinam

Age: 23 years

Vocation: Hairdressing

Mary's story is very sad. She has never been to school, and her parents are extremely poor. She lived with an aunt and helped her to sell kenkey (a local food made out of corn). Mary was maltreated until she couldn't take it anymore, and left to stay with her parents. Life was a struggle; and her faith in God was really shaken because of what she was going through.



Mary left her parents and came to stay with a family friend in Accra as a house help. The lady promised to register her to learn hairdressing, but the promise never came through.

Mary was introduced to AE by Mrs. Sandra Buernor. AE enrolled her in a hairdressing training centre and she is happily learning her dream vocation.

Age: 18 years

Vocation: Dressmaking

He is enrolled in an ICT training centre in Accra.

Age: 23 years Vocation: ICT

Princella completed her SHS* education but couldn't continue to study at secretarial school because of financial constraints. She is a Christian.

She couldn't continue her education to the SHS level because of financial difficulties (her father passed away, and her mother who is a baker, fell sick and never regained her strength). Pastor Isaac, a volunteer of AE, introduced Lordina to AE. AE interviewed her, registered and enrolled her in a dressmaking centre.



Name: Favour Adeve

Age: 24 years

Vocation: Dressmaking

Favour completed JHS*. Her father is deceased, but her mother and 4 other siblings in the Volta Region. Favour lives with her sister at Kasoa, and she is a Christian.

When Favour completed JHS*, she couldn't continue with her education because there was no financial assistance. Favour stayed with several people serving as house help, but unfortunately couldn't save enough money from her meagre salary to pay for a dressmaking apprenticeship.



One day, Favour met a friend who happens to be a beneficiary of AE. Favour's friend introduced her to AE, and by the grace of God Favour was enrolled in a dressmaking centre. Though she has faced a lot of struggles, Favour's faith in God remains steadfast.



Name: Dora Bekoe Age: 17 years

Vocation: Dressmaking

Dora comes from a large family of 11 children. She completed JHS*, but because both her parents are subsistence farmers, there was not enough money to allow her to complete further study. When Dora completed school, she became a picker on a cocoa farm for a year, before finally coming to Accra to stay with an aunt.

She sold pure water at Kasoa to support herself.

Fortunately for Dora, her aunt is a friend to a woman whose daughter is a beneficiary of AE. The woman brought Dora to AE office where she was interviewed and was registered in a dressmaking centre.

Dora is a committed Christian who always trusts in God's provision, despite her struggles in life. She is so happy and very grateful to AE.

Age: 21 years

Vocation: Dressmaking

Grace's father has passed away and her mother is deaf and dumb. From a young age Grace worked as house help to help her pay for school to the end of JHS*.

After school, she told her guardian she wanted to become a dressmaker. Grace's guardian couldn't raise the money for the apprenticeship, so Grace left to stay with her maternal uncle. Unfortunately Grace's uncle couldn't afford to pay her tuition fees either. She felt much challenged by the things that happened to

In God's providence, a neighbour of her uncle is a dressmaker, and this woman introduced Grace to AE. The woman brought her to the AE office, and Grace was interviewed and registered.
